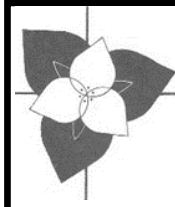

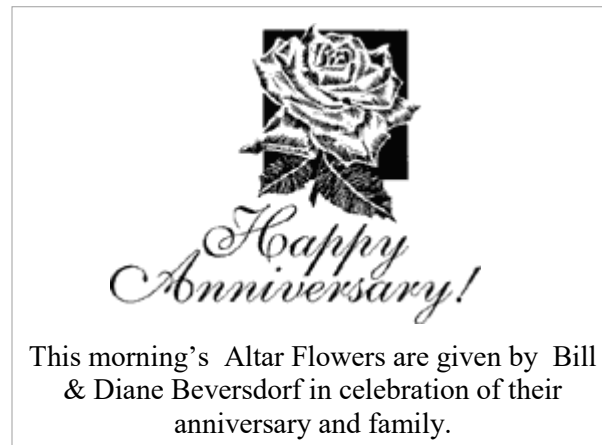

The Mobile Pantry is the Recipient of the Trinity Grocery Cart for the Month of September 2024

The Mobile Pantry is the recipient of the Trinity Grocery Cart for the month of September. The Mobile Food Pantry is operated by the Hunger and Poverty Prevention Partnership to ensure that rural residents of Portage County have access to food assistance as needed. It is headquartered at Beloved Community Church.

The second and fourth Thursdays of the month, the items donated are sorted and packaged to be delivered to recipients who may have no other way to get food. Fresh produce from local grocery stores and the Giving Gardens are packaged for delivery. 40-50 people are helped each month, mostly elderly and low income people who have limited transportation or disabilities.

Food items needed include; peanut butter, jelly, chicken in a can, sugar, flour and canned fruit.

Non-food items needed include; laundry detergent, dish soap, shampoo, conditioner, body wash and deodorant.
