And in his act of turning the jars of water into wine, it’s the first time that Jesus publicly reveals himself to the world. In doing so, this first miracle of Jesus helps cause his disciples to believe in him and brings joy and relief to a newlywed couple. Can you remember a time when you felt your faith grow after Jesus helped you out of a difficult situation?</p>
